1917



### *Frontline Angels*

Eight Australian nurses, Sister Dorothy Crowl, Clara Dixon, Mary Jane Dorrer, Alice Ross-King, Richard Peall, Ellen King and Pearl Corkhill were awarded the Military Medal "for acts of gallantry and devotion to duty under fire" when they rescued and treated patients from burning tents during bombing raids on military clearing stations located in the Western Front, France during July 1917.



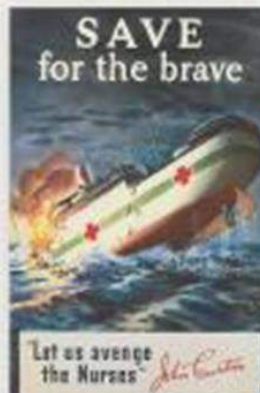

### *Gauntlet at Sea*

Sister Ellen Savage was awarded the George Medal for her "complete gallantry" in loading and manning survivors in a raft following the sinking of the Australian Hospital Ship Centaur, even though she was badly injured herself.

Centaur was sunk by Japanese torpedoes in May 1943 off the coast of Morotai Island with terrible loss of life. Of the 12 nurses on board, only Sister Savage survived the sinking.

### *Bravery under Fire*

Captain Carol Vaughan Evans was awarded the Medal for Gallantry for "exceptional leadership, personal courage and exceptional performance of duty" as the Medical Officer in command of the casualty clearing post at Khe Sanh, Vietnam during the massacre of civilian refugees in April 1975.

This was the first time Australian soldiers had been awarded gallantry medals since the Vietnam War.

# Courage Under Fire

## CENTENARY OF ANZAC TRIBUTE

In July 1917 the first bravery medals for courage under fire were awarded to Australian servicemen, Army nurses serving on the Western Front during the Great War of 1914-1918.

On the 100th Anniversary of their heroic deeds, we pay tribute to the "Anzac Girls" of 1917 and to the generations of servicemen who followed them with the "Spirit of Anzac" shining through in their deeds, which are exemplified in the acts of bravery below.

---

### Frontline Angels

**22nd JULY 1917 - THE WESTERN FRONT, FRANCE DURING THE FIRST WORLD WAR**

**THE WESTERN FRONT**

*"Where there was life, there was hope, and so long..." - LETTER BY TILTON*

Over 80 per cent of Australian First World War battle casualties occurred on the Western Front. It would take many years for a wounded man to get from the trench into the care of a casualty clearing station. Not surprisingly the sight of a nurse there, to be able to give aid and comfort, was like that of an angel.

Eight Australian Army nurses were awarded the Military Medal, "for gallantry and devotion to duty under fire". This was the highest bravery award available to them. They thought enjoying honorary officer status, the nurses were still considered "other ranks" when it came to awards.

**THE FIRST FOUR**

**SISTERS ALICE (ALYS) ROSS-KING, CLARE DEACON AND DOROTHY CAWOOD, AND STAFF NURSE MARY JANE DERRER**

*"I shall never forget the awful climb on hands and feet out of that hole when fire fell deep, grey clay and blood, although I did not then know that it was blood!" - MOTHER ALICE ROSS-KING*

These four Australian Army Nursing Sisters (ANS) nurses were the first Australian women to be awarded the Military Medal, which had only been introduced in June 1916 to male nurses.

They were awarded the Military Medal for "showing bravery and devotion to duty under fire" whilst dressing patients trapped in trench lines at No 2 Australian Casualty Clearing Station (DASSCO) Trench Area, France, when it was bombed by German aircraft late in the evening of 22nd July 1917.

**THE NEXT FOUR**

**SISTERS RACHAEL PRATT, ALICIA KELLY, EILEEN KING AND PEARL CORKHILL**

Of the four other Australian nurses who were awarded the Military Medal, three were members of the ANS, while the fourth, Eileen King, worked in the Queen Alexandra's Imperial Nursing Service (QAINS).

Both Eileen King and Eileen King were decorated for continuing to tend to their patients despite both not being termed stretcher bearers from trench burials during July 1917 at Australian and British medical units along the Western Front.

Alicia Kelly and Pearl Corkhill both received orders to seek shelter to remain with the wounded, refusing these and providing comfort to their patients, in August 1917 and were awarded the Military Medal for their actions.

### Courage at Sea

**18th MAY 1941 - HOSPITAL SHIP CENTAUR, OFF THE COAST OF QUEENSLAND DURING THE SECOND WORLD WAR**

**SISTER ELLEN SAVAGE**

In May 1941 the Australian Hospital Ship Centaur set out from Sydney for the second voyage to New Guinea. On board were 12 women crew members supported by the ship's medical staff. At 4.30 am on the 18th May, Centaur was torpedoed by a Japanese submarine off the coast of Queensland, even though it had been lit up and clearly marked with large red crosses.

Sister Savage was awarded the George Medal for "exceptional gallantry" for her heroic efforts in helping survivors to safety following the sinking of Centaur, despite being badly injured herself. OCS crew members, Sister Savage was the only survivor.

### Bravery Under Fire

**22nd - 30th APRIL 1961 - KIBERO REFUGEE CAMP, RWANDA DURING UNITED NATIONS ASSISTANCE MISSION FOR RWANDA (UNAMIR)**

**CAPTAIN CAROL VAUGHAN-EVANS**

*"My husband remembers that on a small airplane, daughter will the Rwandans proved kind in their areas of Rwanda, we got our 20th girl out of there..." - CAPTAIN CAROL VAUGHAN-EVANS*

In the days leading up to ANZAC Day 2001 a small group of Australian troops discovered a special kind of bravery. Working at the Kibero refugee camp in Rwanda, they witnessed the Rwandan Army carry out a major attack on their refugees, none of whom had taken part in the Rwandan genocide of the previous year. The Australians could not stop the massacre, but they courageously continued to work under fire to save as many lives as possible.

Captain Carol Evans was awarded the Medal for Gallantry for "exceptional leadership, personal courage and exceptional performance of duty" as the military officer in command of the medical detachment at Kibero, and for saving the lives of the refugees during the attack on 22nd April 2001. She is the only woman to be awarded a Medal of Gallantry in the Australian Honours system.

The dedication, her compassion and distinction in those she was treating, ability to negotiate when supplies ran low, and understanding of the parties were to the final treatment of the World War II Medal recipient, Army Medical Corps. Her acts of gallantry and leadership while under fire were recognized in all members of the Australian Forces of Support Force "Name of Honour" Chapter 2001.

Four other awards of Kibero, including Captain Carol Vaughan Evans were awarded the Medal of Gallantry for their actions, the first time Australian soldiers had been awarded gallantry awards since the Vietnam War.



*Mothers, Daughters, Wives Stories of the Bundaberg & District Ex Servicewomen* was suggested and compiled by Jennifer Waldron following a five year project undertaken by members of the association.

The indoor and outdoor tributes were another suggestion from President Jenny who put together the concept with assistance from members and graphic artist Tara Jacobsen.

The tributes were funded by a grant from the Department of Veterans Affairs Saluting Their Service and donations from members and friends.

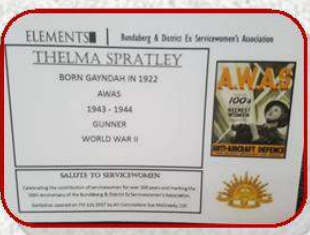
