Recognition goes to the Federal Government and Keith Pitt MP Federal Member for Hinkler for allowing our association the honour of being involved in the nationwide Queen's Platinum Jubilee's tree planting program.

Bundaberg Regional Council, Parks and Garden staff provided essential assistance with technical and planning advice and with the actual tree acqui-

The red tape timeline presented grant organiser Jenny Waldron with arguably her tightest and most challenging schedule but in recognition of the importance of the project she pushed on through the logistical barriers and as a result brought much pride to our association and a noteworthy contribution to Bundaberg's image as a city that pays tribute to worthy historical milestones.

With Angella's assistance the full project will be managed by Jenny through to its completion on 11 November 22.



HERVEY BAY

- Check the level of interest, and if sufficient,
- Obtain a quote for a suitable size coach Hervey Bay return on Saturday 15 October
- obtain committee approval of quote
- Book the coach using the times from 2021 as a guide.
- Check with secretary to ensure a risk assessment has been completed
- Check with Treasurer re members payments and the payment to Hervey Bay by RSVP date
- Have a list of attendees (with mobile numbers) and check them off as they board the bus
- At Hervey Bay, ensure all attendees reboard the bus for the return trip.
- General monitoring all aspects using the guidelines and check lists in Procedures part 3 clause 4

CHRISTMAS

- Check for a venue and a menu quote
- Make recommendation to committee and seek approval for event subsidy.
- Book the venue
- Select the menu with committee and confirm with venue
- Ensure numbers are advised to venue on time
- Work with venue and also with support members to deliver a happy event
- Ensure thank-you letters, if any, are sent by secretary within the first week following.
- Provide feedback if necessary to guide the organiser for the following year.
- General monitoring all aspects using the guidelines and check lists in Procedures part 3 clause 2




