Commemorations



The year 2020 started off well with planning for our normal events along with VP75, when COVID hit and any planned participation in commemorative events changed on a daily basis as restrictions were implemented on gatherings and movement of people.

Anzac Day

While the main ceremonies were cancelled, many Association members marked the day with 'driveway' tributes. Photos of these small, but solemn remembrances were captured and published by the Secretary in an *Anzac Special of Chests Out*.

Del Crowley placed the Association's floral tribute at the Bundaberg Service Women's plaque on Anzac Eve.

Victory In The Pacific 75th Anniversary of the end of World War Two

The planning for this event commenced in 2019 with invitations sent out and guest speakers confirmed. Then COVID-19 hit which had some impact across all planned activities. Guest speakers from ADF representatives were not able to travel and attend. Unfortunately Navy Cadets were not able to participate which meant that a Ceremonial Guard was not able to be provided for any of the services. I have summarised each event below, covering the commemorative activities.

All events adhered to social distancing requirements in place.

Note: Bundaberg District Women Veterans (BDWV) hosted the only formal events held over this weekend.

1600 Friday, 14 August 2020 Sunset Service of Remembrance, Lions Remembrance Park- This service was to honour those women who served during WWII, but it was quickly expanded to include all who served during WWII as a means of saluting them and expressing gratitude for their sacrifices. 11 wreaths were laid and approximately 50 attended this service.

A 'guard' standing behind each memorial was discussed, however, due to numbers of people required, it was decided that placement of a poppy on each memorial prior to the service would be appropriate.

The Banner Parade included the BDWV, 47BN, RAAF, Rats and RSL Banners which were proudly marched in.

1730 Friday, 14 August 2020 Victory Dinner, Rowers on the River- This dinner was to honour those who served during WWII, with five WWII Veterans attending, and celebrate VP75. With the subtle music from the war years being played in the background, 75 attendees enjoyed the evening.

The room was decorated with VP75 bunting strung with fairy lights across the ceiling and memorabilia displayed by the RSL, along with table settings and centrepieces appropriate of the time, giving the room a peaceful ambience. A small ceremony of parading in the Association and RSL banners commenced the evening with the program including a special reciting of the Ode with MC (Jenny)

reading the first verse and two WWII veterans the second (standard) verse, a roll call of WWII attendees, special toasts and a commemorative address "With Victory comes Peace".

0930 Saturday, 15 August 2020 Service of Remembrance, War Nurses Memorial Park- This service was to pay tribute to those who served during WWII, particularly Australia's War Nurses. 12 wreaths were laid and approximately 80 attended this service.

Three bronze plaques were unveiled and dedicated. One to honour and recognise the sacrifices and outstanding contribution of Australia's War Nurses during the Second World War; one being the Honour Roll of Bundaberg and Burnett region nurses of World War Two; and one being the Service of Care and Comfort plaque dedicated to those who provided care and comfort overseas on the battlefield or within Australia for returning wounded and prisoners of war during World War Two.

Vietnam Veterans Day

The Association was represented at Vietnam Veterans Day service held at the Bundaberg Defence Veterans Drop-in Centre.

Remembrance Day

The Association was well represented at the Remembrance Day service held in Anzac Park and in Burnett Heads.

Wellbeing Activities



When COVID Lockdown and restrictions put our calendar of events on hold, it looked like it would be a pretty dismal year for activities and trips for members. However, with hard work from activities and bus sub-committee folk, Lynne, Kay L and Jenny C, we were able to adapt our activities and bus trips to meet all government rules and it is just wonderful that we were been able to conduct almost all of our planned trips and activities. Wellbeing Support Program

"Wellbeing" is the experience of health, happiness, and prosperity. It includes having good mental health, high life satisfaction, a sense of meaning or purpose, and the ability to manage stress. Wellbeing is something sought by just about everyone because it includes so many positive things; feeling happy, healthy, socially connected, and purposeful. To develop genuine wellbeing support, we continue building our social skills, like gratitude, kindness, and communication. Social skills make it easier to have positive interactions with others, helping others to feel less lonely, angry, or disconnected. This interaction develops social wellbeing with the intent to feel more meaningfully connected to others.

The wellbeing team consisting of a wellbeing officer and four wellbeing support officers undertake the bulk of wellbeing work which is regularly reported to committee meetings.

The Wellbeing Team for 2020 was: Sharon Cord-Wellbeing Officer. Lynne Pollock, Jenny Waldron, Shirley Watson and Leone Wilson OAM– Wellbeing Support Officers. Due to commitments, Sharon Cord needed to take leave of absence and her place was filled by Leone Wilson.

As secretary, Leone was well positioned to undertake a concerted contact campaign by phone and by email during the periods of Covid-19 lockdown and restrictions. At other times, the members of the wellbeing team continued to provide direct and in-direct support to members.

During 2020 several additional members volunteered to undertake one or more wellbeing activities. The work of the team and volunteers had and continues to have, a positive and direct effect on those they engage with. Their efforts are greatly appreciated by us all. General 'mate to mate' support continues within the association by all members.

Wellbeing Support – As stated above there has been frequent contact and /or engagement with our members throughout the year. This has been achieved through various forms of direct and in-direct contact such as home visits, phone or e-mail contacts made to members by the wellbeing officer's team. ATDP Trained Members – the association benefits greatly from having two members qualified through the Advocacy Training Development Program who are operating under the auspices of another ESO. One of these members is serving on the committee and is available to provide good guidance on wellbeing issues to the committee.

Wellbeing Activities – We held bus trips, luncheons, morning teas, 10 pin bowling and kayaking; all aimed at provided enjoyment for our member and these are detailed under Activities in this report.

Commemorative Activities with a Wellbeing Theme – Our hosting of commemorative events in Bundaberg for the Victory in the Pacific 75th anniversary saw the association making contact with 30 World War Two veterans or their family during the planning stages. The more able of these veterans, together with family, participated in the services and dinner and it is known that they were made to feel deservedly special. Following the events, the association produced a souvenir booklet which volunteer members hand-delivered to 28 veterans and, in some cases, quality time was spent talking to these men and women.
